The Hawai'i Chapter of the American Planning Association is pleased to present our 2012 Distinguished Service Award to Mary Alice Evans. Mary Alice was born and raised in Portland, Oregon. She attended University of California-Santa Barbara where she earned a joint Bachelor of Arts in Sociology/Religious Studies. Just prior to her graduation, she met up with a free-spirit type by the name of John Knox, who just happened to be traveling through Santa Barbara at that time. They embarked on a journey to Hawai'i and settled on the Big Island intending to stay there for a short time prior to working their way around the world. They got as far as O'ahu. With John working in Honolulu, Mary Alice pursued her Masters of Arts in Urban and Regional Planning at UH - Mānoa. Mary Alice participated in a program which at the time offered State financial assistance for higher education if the student recipient would commit to a state job upon graduation, if one was offered. Upon graduation, Mary Alice was offered a position which at the time was in the State's Department of Planning. 
